A number of curriculum enrichment days/weeks/events will be held throughout the year, including anti-bullying week, charities week, Global learning events, maths celebrations, Science Investigation events, Armed Forces Day, Remembrance Day events, Macmillan coffee afternoon, World book week, Fairtrade fortnight, British values events, music/theatre events, celebrations etc.

Educational visits will be arranged to enhance learning in a particular topic/area and visitors to school will be invited to share their knowledge and experiences with pupils throughout the year.
