I Must.....

Read my reading book **every** night – this does not have to be the whole book! Practise reading fluently and with expression. Remember to predict what might happen next.

Practise my spelling activities **to help me recognise and use the spelling patterns.**

Learn to spell and read the words on my CEW list (Common Exception Words list) – by the end of year 2 we should know them all!

Practise my handwriting: can you join your letters, make them the right size and make sure they sit on the line correctly?

Practise telling the time: o'clock, half past, quarter to + past and as a challenge – to the nearest five minutes

Practise recognising and using fractions (half, quarters, thirds) with shapes and numbers.

Can you grow your own plants? What will you choose? How do you need to look after it?



Write a plant diary – each week you could measure your plant and describe any changes.



Investigate and research:
What are gardens like in other countries?

Choose a country to investigate. Are the plants similar or different to those found in your garden?
Search engines like 'Kiddle' and 'safe search kids' are good ones to use.



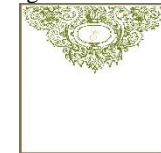
I wonder... what would your secret garden look like? Can you describe it using noun phrases, metaphor, simile, alliteration?
