

Talk for Writing

All the Year 1 – 6 classes have embarked on their second unit of 'Talk for Writing' learning this week. This is a well-established nationwide strategy for developing writing. Using actions and story maps to help them, all of the children learn a text by heart, including the punctuation. They then alter and 'innovate' this text on the way to producing pieces of independent writing. Eagle Owls (above) have been working on actions for *The Nightmare Man!* Sam-Luca from Eagle Owls says "Talk for Writing helps you to learn the features of a text". Poppy: "It gets you to use different words". Bethan says: "I like it when we get part of the text and work it out at our table".
