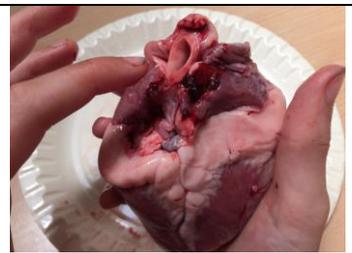
Visit from Author
