Please wash the bottle following the care instructions detailed below. Bottles will be sent home at the end of each day for washing and need to be returned to school the following morning. Washing care instructions appear on the bottles and, as per the manufacturer, are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do not immerse in boiling water • Bottle & cap should be washed in warm soapy water & rinsed in clean water • Maximum dishwasher temperature of 65°C (on top shelf only) • A mild bleach solution, such as 'Milton', may be used <p>If caps are washed at a higher temperature than recommended, they will shrink & will not fit the bottles. The bottles are to be filled with water only, as we are a 'Healthy School'.
