Active Learning in Science!



Tawny Owls have been practising their scientific practical skills by using pipettes, water and acid to identify different kinds and types of rocks. They investigated whether the rocks they were given were permeable or impermeable; and whether they were soft or hard. They then used an identification chart to find out the names of the rocks.
