Whole School Theme - Adventures in Time

This half term we will be beginning our new theme in History of the Romans. During this topic we will be learning about the Celts before the Romans arrived in Britain, Julius Caesar, how the Romans invaded Britain and the British resistance to Roman rule. Our theme of the Romans will be integrated in cross-curricular links across a range of other subjects this half term.

In Guided Reading we will be reading Empire's End: A Roman Story by Leila Rasheed. In Maths we will be looking at place value, where we will be representing and partitioning numbers to 1000, using number lines to help us compare and sort numbers up to 10,000 and rounding to the nearest 10, 100, 1000 & 10,000. For our science topic this half term, the children will be learning about Sound by observing over time. This will involve investigating vibrations and pitch. In Spanish, the children will be learning about dates and pets.

In P.E. we will be doing games this half term, so the children are expected to come in P.E. kit on Wednesdays. On Tuesday they should attend school in their school uniform but bring or wear trainers for our Active Session.

In R.E. we will be exploring the question, 'What can we learn from religions about deciding what is right and wrong?' Finally, in Computing, the children will be learning about computing systems and their networks, such as the internet.

During our PSHE lessons this half term, we will be learning about 'me in my world' which includes content about how to be a school citizen, understanding how to work in a class team and exploring what Democracy is. In Art the children will be painting Celtic Tri-spirals and knots with water colours. Y5 will also be having Music lessons with Mr Griffiths, where they will be adapting and transposing motifs.

AR

Children should continue to read regularly at home to help their comprehension skills, writing and spelling. Your children should bring their AR books to school every day.

They will take a STAR reading quiz at the beginning of each half term to revise their coloured book band and have the opportunity to take AR quizzes on Wednesdays. All children have quiet reading time daily at the end of the day and a Guided Reading lesson every day.
