Whole School Theme – Adventures in Time

This half term we will be exploring our new Geography theme of Coasts, during this topic we will be learning about beaches, coastal animals and their food chains, how coasts are formed and the difference between different parts of the U.K. coastline. Our theme will be integrated in cross-curricular learning across a range of different topics over the course of the half term. In Guided Reading we will be reading 'Anglo-Saxon Boy' by Tony Bradman. In Maths we will finish off our unit on Length & Perimeter before beginning Fractions which will include learning about mixed numbers, improper fractions, equivalent fractions and adding & subtracting fractions. For our science topic this half term, the children will be carrying on their unit of electricity.

In P.E. this half term we will be doing ball skills outside. **The children are expected to come in P.E. kit on both Wednesdays and Thursdays.** In R.E. we will be looking at the Christian unit of Salvation and exploring the question: *'Why do Christians call the day that Jesus died, Good Friday?'* Finally, in Computing the children will be learning about data & logging information.

During our PSHE lessons this half term, we will be learning about 'Healthy Me'. In Art children will be using Water Colours to show impressionism, inspired by Monet and his 'Lily Pads'. Y4 will also be having Music lessons, where they will be looking at Samba & Carnival style instruments.

Children should continue to read regularly at home to help their comprehension skills, writing and spelling. Your children should bring their AR books to school every day please.

They will take a STAR reading quiz at the beginning of each half term to revise their coloured book band and have the opportunity to take AR quizzes on Wednesdays. All children have quiet reading time daily at the end of the day and a Guided Reading lesson every day.
