


Welcome to our families old and new!

Thrive Award achieved

We are thrilled to announce that we have been awarded the status of being a 'Thrive' school due to meeting the criteria for embracing the Thrive approach. Thrive is a dynamic, developmental approach to working with children that supports their emotional and social wellbeing and aims to remove barriers to learning for children. All children in school will be offered age-appropriate emotional literacy support and development using the Thrive approach during their weekly PSHE sessions, Collective Worships, emotional check-ins and through our relational and restorative approach to behaviour.

In addition, all children will be profiled termly to identify any emotional gaps or barriers and select children who may benefit from some additional support. Mrs Morris is our Thrive Lead, Mrs Ryan and Mrs Fawcett are our licensed Thrive practitioners.



Harvest Celebration: 3rd and 4th October 2024

We look forward seeing you at our 'Harvest Celebration' on Thursday 3rd October (KS1 pupils starting at 2.30pm) and Friday 4^{th} October (KS2 pupils starting at 9.00am), where each class will have a chance to reflect on a different area of this special time of year. Little Owls will make a brief appearance at the start of our 'Harvest Celebration' for those parents who wish to attend.

As part of the 'Bronze Award Young Leaders', the Year 6 children will be supporting a local charity, Selby Food Bank. They would be grateful if you could donate an item to this local charity. We ask that the children please bring in the item of food from October 3rd and place in the box outside Eagle Owls' classroom by Friday 18th October. The food will then be taken to Selby Food Bank.

The charity is in most need of the following items: Tinned meat/fish/fruit, Tea bags (80s) and coffee, jam and UHT milk 1 litre. The children believe that by donating an item, it will help us all to be thankful for the 'Harvest' and is in the spirit of our collective worship theme of 'generosity'.

School Uniform

The children all look amazing in their pristine school uniform. Thank you for providing black shoes for outdoor use and black pumps for indoor use. A reminder that all long hair should be tied back please, for safety and hygiene reasons.

Water Bottles

All water bottles should be brought into school every day and should contain **WATER ONLY** please. Juice should not be sent to drink. **Also please name all water bottles.** Please name all items so they can be returned when found.

Cool Milk

School milk is available FREE for children under five and is subsidised for over fives. If you would like your child to received milk please register at www.coolmilk.com

Please bear in mind that from registration it can take a couple of weeks before milk is supplied to your child.

Healthy snacks

Please remember that ALL snacks for **ALL YEAR GROUPS** should be healthy and should ONLY consist of fresh fruit, vegetables or dried fruit. No yoghurt, cheese

strings, crisps, waffles, biscuits or chocolate etc...please. As part of the School Fruit & Vegetable Scheme, all pupils in Reception to Year 2 are provided with a piece of fruit/vegetable at breaktime. Please may we also remind you that we are a nut aware school.

School Meals

A school meal costs £3.10 for all pupils from Year 3 to Year 6. Reception to Year 2 pupils receive a free meal under the Universal Infant Free School Meal Scheme. A reminder to parents of Year 3 children that lunches must now be paid for. All meals should also be paid for in advance using ParentPay. Thank you.

Packed Lunches

Thank you for sending in healthy packed lunches. If a yoghurt is provided then please remember to send in a spoon as school is unable to provide one. Chocolate bars and sweets should not be included.

Menu Change

Please note that there is a change to the Menu for this Term. Week 2 will be TOMATO PASTA POT instead of Panini as the Menu says. We will get this corrected on the Menu which is on our website.

Please remind your child(ren) not to bring any toys or footballs to school.
