We set off on the coach in drizzle and the weather just got better and better as we travelled North. Eagle Owls had a fabulous day of `environmental education.' They built solar ovens, water turbines, used data loggers, cooked and ate chocolate & marshmallow smores and climbed many trees!		
THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND	<i>Molly and Evelyn wrote:</i> At Howsham Mill we learnt about how the actual Mill worked and the Greek mythology associated with it. We made a solar oven using cardboard, tin foil, cling film and newspaper strips and it melted our chocolate! The temperature inside our oven rose to 63 degrees celsius! When we arrived, we learnt how the windows were actually false to save money as glass was costly. We deduced that the stone statue on the gothic style building was in fact Artemis – the Goddess of the hunt and wild animals. Some people believe that otters were once hunted – hundreds of years ago - by the people who lived in Howsham Hall along the banks of the river beside the Mill. As we were finding out about the Archimedes screw turbines that genrate hydro-elecyticity for local houses and Howsham Hall, we searched for the otters that presently live along the river banks.		

During the afternoon, we made 'water wheels' and tested them out – they worked!

The toilets were interesting as they were composting ones and well ventilated - airy! We ate marshmallow, biscuit and chocolate smores around the camp fire. They were delicious!
