

## **The Romans**

## The Romans invasion of Britain

- To know the reasons why the Romans wanted to invade Britain (to gain access to resources, to expand the empire, for power, to use the Britons as slaves)
- To know how the British responded and fought back against the Roman army (the Romans were only successful on their third attempt, Boudicca's uprising)
- To understand why the Roman army was so successful (well organised, highly trained, sophisticated armour, physically fit, formations to protect themselves, never giving up)
- To infer about life in Roman times from artefacts.
- To know how the Roman occupation changed life in Britain today (roads, plumbing, different foods, bath houses, education, laws, Latin, Christianity).
