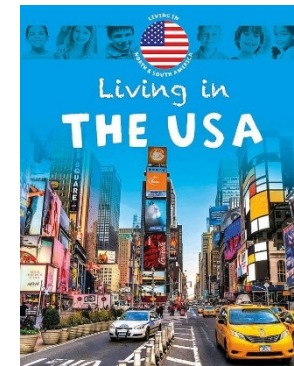
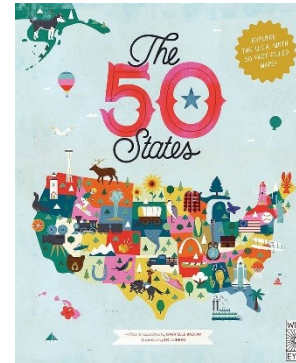


Compare the UK to other places

Vocabulary	Definition
state	A geographical area managed politically within a federation
county	An area of a country with boundaries which is run by a council under the national Government
Hemisphere	Half of the globe (Northern or Southern)
climate	Weather conditions over a long period of time
time zone	A range of longitudes with a common standard time
island	Piece of land surrounded by water
continent	Main continuous expanse of land
ocean	Very large expanse of sea
capital	City where Government sits in a country
monarch	An individual who rules a state or empire
Prime minister	Leader of Government
President	Leader of State and Government
democracy	Everyone gets to vote for leadership
population	Number of people living in an area
Physical features	Rivers, mountains and other naturally occurring features
Human features	Population, buildings and other man-made features

- Both the UK and USA are within the Northern Hemisphere
- The UK is a temperate climate while the USA covers a variety of climates from tropical to arctic
- The UK has a monarch who is Head of State and a Prime Minister who is Head of Government
- The USA has a President who is Head of State and Government
- Both countries are democratic
- The UK is an island but the USA is part of a continental mass
- Buildings have different styles in the UK and USA
- Cities have evolved differently in the USA compared with the UK e.g. grid street layout
